Background: What is Efficiency Vermont?

- Regulated utility, comparable to GMP or Vermont Electric Co-op
- Serves the entire state (except Burlington)
- Focus includes both electricity and heating fuels




Background: Efficiency Vermont accountability

- Performance-based model
- Required to meet performance goals, such as -
 - Energy savings
 - Geographic equity
 - Benefits for low-income Vermonters
 - Residential vs. business equity
- Independent evaluation of results each year
- Performance judged every 3 years




Results: In 2013, energy efficiency represented 13% of VT's electric portfolio

Results: Rapid increase in weatherizing Vermont homes

Efficiency Vermont customer support: answering energy questions from Vermont homes and businesses

Looking to 2015-17: Program budgets and funding sources

- Electric efficiency: \$148.1 million
 - Funded by the Energy Efficiency Charge
- Thermal efficiency: \$19.5 million
 - Funded by the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative and Forward Capacity Market
- Funding sources <u>must be kept separate</u>



Looking to 2015-17: <u>Some</u> expectations from our regulator (Public Service Board)

- 1. \$336.3 million in economic benefits
- 2. 321,800 MWh savings
- 3. 41,300 kW summer peak demand savings
- 4. 53,700 kW winter peak demand savings
- 5. Deliver high quality services for low-income Vermonters
- 6. Increased focus on reducing heating costs for small businesses
