

Thetford Volunteer Assisted Weatherization Program

Project Goals

 Develop a program to assist those whose homes were in need of weatherization, but who could not afford it and did not qualify for the free Weatherization Assistance Program



Target Income Level

- Worked with Capstone Community Action which runs Weatherization Assistance Program in Orange County
- Thetford VAW set at 60% to 90% AMI (Annual Median Income)





Home Performance Incentives

- Efficiency Vermont approved that work done would qualify for financial incentives through the Do-It-Yourself track of the Home Performance with ENERGY STAR program
- Incentives from the improvements were redirected into the Thetford VAW Fund for future jobs





Grant Money

- \$2,500 from Vt. Community Foundation and Ben & Jerry's to:
 - Hire a Home Performance with ENERGY STAR contractor
 - Pay for materials



Finding Candidates

- Sought participants through:
 - Local churches
 - Town food shelf
 - Thetford Elder Network
 - Capstone (folks who had applied to them, but were above their qualifying levels)
- Two candidates for this first pilot outreach effort
- Chose Lorraine Carbino's home in Thetford Center, Vermont





Home Performance Contractor

Hired Building Energy to

- Do test-in and test-out Home
 Performance Assessments
- Develop a work scope and materials list
- Train (as needed) and oversee a team of skilled volunteers installing the measures
- Submit a final Home Performance
 HERO report to Efficiency Vermont





Volunteers

- Recruited 11 skilled carpenters and weatherization contractors
 - Contributed 107 hours

Project Savings

- Audit test-out report determined:
 - Air leakage reduced by just over 10%
 - Energy use reduced by more than 21%
 - Estimated annual fuel savings of \$488.50
 - Reduce CO₂ emissions by 2,800 lbs. per year



Project Finances

- Labor and material costs for this work totaled \$2,770 (\$2,500 from grants)
- Efficiency Vermont paid \$970 in incentives
- Net cost of the job is \$1,800
- Energy savings will pay for the cost of improvements in less than four years



Next Steps

- Select board approved ongoing efforts
- Thetford nonprofit Opompanoosuc Community Trust will accept taxdeductible charitable donations from Thetford residents and businesses to pay for ongoing VAW projects
