How NEGEF Defines Grassroots

Groups, formal and informal, working at the neighborhood or municipal level that have.....

- No more than 2 full time employees and
- Annual operating budgets under \$100,000
- Are NOT statewide projects

Most groups are all-volunteer with budgets under \$10,000 a year






NEGEF's Small Grants Program



\$250 - \$1,000
rolling online application
dedicated to help
innovative, largely volunteer
groups launch projects and
build the group.



\$1,000 - \$3,500
 online application deadline:
 March 15 & September 15
 dedicated to help established groups increase capacity, collaborate, and leverage impact.



2013 program launch
 individual stipend grants for innovative grassroots leaders to sustain their volunteer work, gain professional leadership development.

Key Organizing Steps

Caution: Avoiding Them Means Being LESS Effective In the Long Run!

- 1. Form or enhance your leadership group.
- 2. What's your vision, mission and goals for your energy planning process?
- 3. Who's Missing? Early and broad participation is critical to success.
- 4. Energy Planning: Conduct an energy inventory, audits and renewable energy assessment.
- 5. Report Your Findings: Builds Support
- 6. Draft a Energy Chapter in your Master Plan





What Do You Want to Accomplish? One-Off Project or Multiple Efforts?

- ➤ Mission: Answers the question: Why does your group exist?
- ➤ Vision: Answers the question: where do you hope to go in the future and what it will look like?
- ➤ Goals: Are specific to the groups mission, what you wish to accomplish from your efforts





Who's Missing? Who Can Help Reach Your Goals?


- Town and School Representatives
